LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Your libraries stay busy creating fun events plus keeping their buildings ready for everyone's use.

In June, they had 9 programs with over 718 attendees. Summer Reading allowed them to work with the community and local businesses. They had two educational programs from Smithgall Woods, located in Helen, GA. The petting zoo event was always a big hit! Our libraries are fortunate to have Wildlife Wonders located in Cleveland, GA with which to work.

Chill & Fill, located in Blairsville, was a part of two events and everyone loved the free snow cones. Touch a Truck event is something they hope to celebrate annually. Thanks to the help of Tyler Keyes, there was a fire truck, ambulance, police cars, and more available for kids to see and experience. This was a wonderful opportunity for children to see who the helpers in their community are without being in a moment of crisis.



Our STEAM-ulation Lab events continued to delight kids! In May there was a mythical creature hunt at both libraries. It was a variation of their Leprechaun Hunt in March. These small activities get kids in the libraries, walking around, and finding new spaces and hopefully new books. May was also the Fantasy Golf Course build. Kids took home kits to make a golf hole, and we assembled all of them to create a golf course! All the entries were very creative, and the attendance was great. One of the SRP events was a whole science day- everyone had a blast with Mentos and Diet Coke!

All the library staff's programs and events are greatly helped by community support. Whole families attended our summer programs this year. It was exciting and reaffirming to see more people attending events and coming into the libraries.

Mountain Regional Library-Young Harris and Towns County Library-Hiawassee will be offering several programs over the next few months. August is a planning month for the libraries as they wind down from the Summer Reading Program. One focus for fall will be monthly cultural celebrations with food and crafts! September will be an Asian Mid-Autumn festival, and in October we'll celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month. We Are Inevitable by Gayle Forman

So far, the inevitable hasn't worked out so well for Aaron Stein. While his friends have gone to college and moved on with their lives, Aaron's been left behind in the Cascade Mountains of Washington State, running a failing bookshop with his dad, Ira. What he needs is a lucky break, the good kind of inevitable. And then he meets Hannah. Incredible Hannah – magical, musical, brave and clever. Could she be the answer?

The Lincoln Highway by Amor Towles

In June, 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson is driven home to Nebraska by the warden of the work farm where he has just served a year for involuntary manslaughter. His mother long gone, his father recently deceased, and the family farm foreclosed upon by the bank, Emmett's intention is to pick up his eight-year-old brother and head west where they can start their lives anew. But when the warden drives away, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm have hidden themselves in the trunk of the warden's car. Together, they have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future.

The Last Thing He Told Me by Laura Dave

In this novel, Hannah Michaels finds out that her husband Owen is being investigated for a crime and has now gone missing. She's left alone with her 16-year-old stepdaughter, Bailey, who dislikes her. Together the two must work together to figure out the truth behind Owen's disappearance. This will lead them down a path that reveals old family secrets and tests Hannah and Bailey's relationship.

The Four Winds by Kristin Hannah

This novel is a survival story about resilience, family, courage, and the American Dream during the Great Depression. The central character, Elsa Wolcott, is a woman trying to raise two children on a farm in the Great Plains during the Dust Bowl following the Great Depression. She watches as the lands around her crack in their parched state and the hopelessness that threatens to break the spirit of those around her. As the situation worsens, Elsa is forced to make a decision to stay and fight or leave for the uncertain and unfamiliar lands in the West.

Use “Friends Picks” bookmarks in the bookstores, inside both Towns County libraries, to list your recommendation with the title, author, and personal comments about that book.
