Our library system continues to add new tools to use. Kanapy.com is a streaming service available to all who have a library card. Check out the collection of films with no commercials. Once the app is downloaded, it is easy to set up. There is also a Kanapy for children's movies. Every month, 12 credits are issued to each user. They expire at the end of each month, and the remaining credits do not roll over. Some films necessitate two credits, and a few require four credits. Viewers are allowed 72 hours to stream a title.

HAPPENINGS AT MOUNTAIN REGIONAL LIBRARY



We had a wonderful holiday season at Mountain Regional. A highlight of the holiday season was patrons of all ages creating ornaments for our 10 foot tall Christmas tree. The Christmas tree



provided the perfect backdrop for *Storytelling by the Christmas Tree with Kanute Rarey*. Mr. Rarey led 2 sessions, one for children and one for adults. We also had

a magical visit from Santa who answered all the important "Santa" questions and even joined in activities in the youth room with Mrs. Claus. Thanks to FOLTC, each family was gifted a special holiday book. Throughout the month we had many patrons taking advantage of our gift wrapping station and craft stations throughout the library.



Our Kids Club has been busy with Lego events, learning about artists while trying out techniques, exploring science (volume and mass, chemical reactions and gravity), STEM challenges, and enjoying games and fun together. Our weekly Wednesday morning Story & Play for toddlers features a different concept with a story and sensory activities to engage our young patrons. The Towns County Literacy Bus came by for a wonderful visit. And the big news with the children and families has been the addition of Daisy, our reading dog. The children love reading to Daisy when she visits a few times each month.

In January we celebrated the one year anniversary of our Mystery Book Club with an Agatha Christie doubleheader: *The Christie Affair* and *The Mysterious Affair at Styles*. Everyone is welcome to join these lively book club meetings each month on the 4th Thursday.

We kicked off a new monthly book club featuring cookbooks. Each month we will explore a different cuisine and then come together for a potluck sampling! 

FOLTC INCOME 2024 \$10,996


2024 turned out to be another great example of our community supporting its libraries. The two library book stores raised \$6,192 or 12% more than last year. Total income for 2024 was more than sufficient to cover all the needs of the FOLTC and library staff, which provided for the increase in library attendance and the number of programs presented at the libraries.

FOLTC EXPENSES 2024 \$10,996

2024 saw an increased number of library programs especially for the children. As Ann Lewis and Kevin Kirby, our library managers, discovered all the programs that the FOLTC would fund for them. \$5,000 shown under both MRHQ and Encumbered is for the 2024 & 2025 Towns County Sole Commissioner Grant that Mr. Bradshaw awards each year that the FOLTC matches it. These funds are for our two libraries to use as they need.
